## BACT Conducted a Survey Amongst the Passengers

The Survey, which was discussed in the previous newsletter, indicated that most were satisfied generally with the services we provide. However, requests for low-floor buses and upgrading of our vehicles was made; also an extension of the office hours to cover all day. On these points, I will clarify the situation:

1. **Low floor buses** are only suitable for town work. They are no good for country lanes and speed humps or level crossings.
2. We are continuing to **upgrade our vehicles** and have recently purchased an additional bus.
3. We can only run the **office hours** as part-time [10am-1pm] and we provide an answer machine for those ringing who are encouraged to leave a message, as it will be picked up the following day.
4. There were a number of requests for **other trips** that we will research and see if they are possible. In consideration of this, we are looking at converting shopping trips [B80/81/82] to VARIABLE services presently [we are awaiting ESCC review first]...

My thanks goes to all who returned the forms, as it was a great help in foreword planning. I would encourage phoning the ESCC voiceline to lodge any requests with them during their "countywide consultation" on planning transport provision for the next five years.
